

A significant number of children who attend Abbott House's Community School Resource Program in the Bronx are homeless and reside in shelters. These families are living below the poverty line and the assistance they receive, or income made, goes largely to food and season-appropriate clothing. At times, there is nothing left for personal hygiene items. This impacts appropriate socialization, learning, and can sometimes result in bullying. When concerns about the children and parents' hygiene were addressed, staff learned that the families did not have enough income to purchase laundry detergent and body soap.
